read books on their reading level or a little above, not only to challenge their skills but also influence their minds positively.

Preschool children are encouraged to participate in the 'Read-To-Me' program and are needed to have 10 books read to them. Children of school-age who read in the program, keep interested in reading. The program helps them keeping interested in reading and to retaining the skills they need to learn in school later on. This helps developing an "I-Can-Do" attitude and elevates their self-esteem, preparing them for the next school term they are expected to attend.

She has thus been influencing several children through her storytelling for more than 30 years. By her excellent manner of storytelling, 'she gets children on the road to success.' They listen, understand, react and adopt so many good things out of her narration. Most of it, it is her way of helping to conceive different turns one gets in life, and how to win over the difficulties that one encounters in life. Besides, each story she narrates, contains something new in it. It broadens children's limited horizons, helps them learn how to react to new situations and how to converse with their own peers. Is it not a lot to know at that tender age when children don't get all that and don't know so many of those things as they live in inadequate environments due to poverty and so many other reasons?

#### **Build a Better World**

Emma Lou's way of story narration is unique and highly valuable. It leads to build

a better world for the children. One of the most valuable components of storytelling session is children learning to listen. Regardless of what is being taught; be it the alphabet, mathematics, fairy-tales, tales about the great persons of the world or relating morals. Little children cannot learn if they are unwilling to listen. The 30 minutes session requires the children to sit and listen to the story. It normally takes three to four weeks for children to learn to 'sit and listen'. If a child does not know how to listen, you are just taking in the wind. It is one of the most important points relating Emma's story telling program. Besides, parents are also the core influence. Using manipulative games, music and illustrated voices, she helps to keep children's interest intact which is really vital.
